Business & Cultural Mission to United Arab Emirates & Turkey April 17-27, 2014 Agenda



Mayor Dyer will travel to the United Arab Emirates and Turkey on a business and cultural trade mission with GOAA, Orlando City Soccer and the Atlantic Institute, Orlando's local Turkish cultural center.

Objectives of the trip:

The objectives of the trip are two-fold.

Business:

- Mayor Dyer will meet with airlines in Dubai and Istanbul to make the case that Orlando is ripe for additional air service. Phil Rawlins, President of Orlando City Soccer will join Mayor Dyer in these meetings to promote Orlando's new Major League Soccer franchise and the potential this could have for additional air service demand.
- While in Turkey, the group will also be meeting with other business organizations to discuss synergies and potential economic development exchange between Orlando and Turkey.
- Mayor Dyer will be meeting with the CEO of a company the Metro Orlando EDC has been working with to promote Orlando as the location for US headquarter operation.

Cultural:

The Atlantic Institute, Orlando's local Turkish cultural center, hosts several cultural Trans-Atlantic
exchange trips to Turkey each year to facilitate intercultural understanding and to build bridges between
the US and Turkey.

The trip will be a balance of business and culture allowing the delegation to pursue future opportunities for both economic development and cultural exchange between Orlando, the United Arab Emirates and Turkey.

Meeting with ESIDEF Representing TUSKON (Turkish Confederation of Businessmen and Industrialists)

Members of the delegation will meet with ESIDEF Reresenting TUSKON (Turkish Confederation of Businessmen and Industrialists) which is the largest non-governmental, non-profit institution representing the business community in Turkey. With more than 40,000 members, 90% of its membership is comprised of small or medium establishments with fewer than 50 employees. TUSKON also organizes trade and investment delegations to potentially viable countries.

Meeting with Mayor Aziz Kocaoğlu, Mayor of Izmir

Aziz Kocaoğlu (born 1948) is the mayor of Izmir Metropolitan Municipality, Turkey's third largest city.

He was born in 1948 in Tokat in north-central Turkey. He graduated from the Economy School of Izmir's Ege University in 1973 and received a master's degree in management from Istanbul University in 1974. Between 1975 and 1978 he was an accountant in a public institution. In 1979, he launched his own business in furniture and ceramics. At the same time, he started his political activities in the frame of the youth branch of CHP. After the general interruption of political activities in the eighties in Turkey, he joined in 1987 the newly established SODEP which was the country's main center-left party at the time. After SODEP and the re-established CHP were merged, he became a CHP member again, pursuing and developing his business activities at the same time.

Rising in the rank and file of CHP's İzmir branch, he was elected the mayor of Bornova (a metropolitan district of İzmir) after the local elections of 28 March 2004. Following the sudden death of İzmir Metropolitan Municipality mayor Ahmet Piriştina, Mr. Kocaoğlu was elected by CHP's İzmir branch to the post of metropolitan mayor.

Since then, although drawing a quieter profile than his predecessor, Aziz Kocaoğlu established himself with his orderly conduct of the city's affairs, sound financial management and smooth human relations, as exemplified during the Universiade 2005 games which İzmir had assumed. Aziz Kocaoğlu is married and has two children.

Business Meetings in Istanbul

Meeting with Istanbul Chamber of Industry

Members of the delegation will meet with the Istanbul Chamber of Industry, founded in 1952, whose main objective is to fulfill the existing and future needs of the Turkish industry through information, training and consulting services, to improve the international competitiveness of Turkey and to contribute to the development of the country as a whole.

Meeting with Mayor Kadir Topcu, Mayor of Istanbul

He was born on 8 January 1945 in Altıparmak village of Yusufeli district in Artvin Province, Turkey. Kadir Topbaş moved in 1946 with his family to Istanbul. He earned a PhD in architectural history from Istanbul University following his education of theology in 1972 and architecture in 1974. After working as preacher in Edirne, teacher and freelance architect in Istanbul, he served between 1994 and 1998 as advisor to Mayor Recep Tayyip Erdoğan for the restoration and decoration of palaces and other historical buildings in Istanbul.

He is also owner of Turkish cuisine restaurant chain Saray Muhallebicisi.

He entered politics as member of the religious oriented Milli Selamet Partisi (MSP) and became Mayor of Beyoğlu district in İstanbul, where he lives. Later on, Topbaş ran twice for the deputy of Artvin province in the parliament, first in 1977 from the MSP and then in 1987 from Refah Partisi (RP) without success. In 1999, he was elected mayor of Beyoğlu district from the Fazilet Partisi (FP). In the 2004 regional elections, Kadir Topbaş ran for the post of mayor of İstanbul from the Adalet ve Kalkınma Partisi (AKP) and won. He is mayor of İstanbul since March 28, 2004. In November 2007 he became co-president of United Cities and Local Governments and was longlisted for the 2008 World Mayor award. Kadir Topbaş was re-elected as the mayor of İstanbul metropolitan area in 2009 Turkish general local elections, passing the runner-up Kemal Kilicdaroglu, current leader of Republican People's Party.

In 2009 he was appointed President of the Union of Municipalities of Turkey.

He is married and has two sons and a daughter.

Meeting with Journalist and Writers Foundation

Members of the delegation will meet with the Journalists and Writers Foundation (JWF) which was established by a group of distinguished writers, scholars, and journalists in 1994 to contribute to peaceful coexistence and dialogue by bringing together intellectuals from all political spectrums with different cultural, religious, ethnic and ideological backgrounds that belong to the many diverse disciplines in science, religion, philosophy, politics, and art. Its mission is to look for ways of building a common living space based on reconciliation and mutual respect.

Meeting with Bank Asya

With 182 branches, two national and 1300 correspondent banks, Bank Asya, which was established in 1996 has become the largest participation bank in Turkey.
